Local History

Local History – Benjamin Drawwater 1742 - 1815

In December, we welcomed the Reverend David Speed, who talked to us about Benjamin Drawwater, who lived in Mansfield and Eastwood and is buried in Greasley churchyard. Reverend David had done an impressive amount of research into Benjamin's life and career, using a variety of resources.

Drawwater had a very interesting career and sailed with Captain Cook on his second expedition (1772 – 1775), exploring the coastline of Australia and reaching almost to the tip of Antarctica. It was a privilege to be included on Captain Cook's voyage, since he was already famous as an explorer, and the journey was very well equipped, including tools to produce fresh water out of salt water. Passengers included an artist, a botanist and scientists. Benjamin was employed as the surgeon's second mate and was able to assist the surgeon as well as learning the trade.

Captain Cook's voyage lasted a long three years and it is remarkable that only four men out of a total crew of two hundred and four died. This was mainly due to the rigorous hygiene methods employed by Cook and his use of sauerkraut and fresh fruit (where available) to prevent scurvy.

After this voyage, Drawwater was employed as a surgeon on different naval ships during the American War of Independence, before retiring to Eastwood, where he set up a practice. It is not known exactly where he lived in Eastwood, but we do know that he married the daughter of a local gentleman, Dorothy Toplis, so he must have been considered to be a man of a certain status. Her parents' graves are also in Greasley churchyard.
